But this isn't just a 'paint by numbers' guide. You can, of course help yourself to any of the examples we have provided. But we would love you to be inspired to come up with your own brilliant – and perhaps ever-so-slightly mad – ideas.

So, as you read on, prepare to be reassured, informed and inspired. You are about to have a lot of fun raising this money – trust us!

IT REALLY IS OK TO ASK FOR MONEY

'O our God, we thank you and praise your glorious name! But who am I, and who are my people, that we could give anything to you? Everything we have has come from you, and we give you only what you first gave us!' I Chronicles 29:13-14

It is a well-known statistic that 99% of the population when asked, 'Would you like to make a difference?' say YES!

ONLINE GIVING

One of the simplest way to raise money is by creating an online giving page. Mission Direct recommends BT MyDonate. It easy if you just follow the steps:

- √ Go to www.btplc.com/mydonate and click on 'Start Fundraising'
- ✓ Click on 'Create My Challenge' and this will take you step by step through creating a fundraising page to suit your event.
- ✓ Online giving works best if you are asking them to sponsor you for a particular event.
- ✓ Please email us at the office (info@missiondirect.org) once you have set up a site so that we can allocate the money correctly.
- ✓ Once your giving page has been set up, post a link to it on your Facebook and Twitter pages so that everyone knows what you are doing.
- ✓ Don't forget to email people who are not on Facebook or Twitter with the link also. Note, this is a really effective tool for raising money from those people who you don't see regularly.



YOU KNOW A LOT OF PEOPLE.

Think about how you spend your time and who you come into contact with each day. Each of these people is a potential donor. You don't know the contacts that they have. At every opportunity tell people about what you are doing and see what it leads to.

HOW TO USE THIS PAGE?

This is your space to get your thoughts on paper. Make a note of all those people that you share your life with. We've given you some headings to get you thinking.

PROMISE AUCTION

Are you a fantastic photographer? A brilliant babysitter? A shockingly-good chauffeur? Gather a group of friends together and auction off your skills to the highest bidder. It could be anything from two hours of ironing service to a haircut.

Handy hint: Make sure you have a well briefed auctioneer who can get the crowd into the spirit of the event.



BAG PACK

It's the age old question: can you put frozen peas in with milk? And is it OK to fit in some spring greens down the side if they won't get squashed? Offer some unexpected assistance in the bagging area of your local supermarket and make a mint from grateful shoppers.

Handy hint: Have a chat with the supermarket manager to see if they have any requirements for the job.

COUNTRY THEMED EVENING

No, not stetsons and line-dancing! Get some friends together for an evening – wear the local dress, sample some traditional foods and tell them all about the trip.

Handy hint: The internet is teeming with national recipes. And be prepared to make a few judicious ingredient replacements – with a bit of help from the web again!



COFFEE MORNING

It's a fool-proof fundraiser for the less ostentatious fundraiser! No-one can refuse a coffee and a homemade muffin. Charge to attend.


Handy hint: Be classy: make it 'fair trade' and get some delicious teas and coffees.



SPONSORED EVENTS

Are you ready for a personal challenge? Commit to a sponsored cycle, swim or gentle ramble. Or, if you really want to give something back to your sponsors, how about a sponsored silence?

Handy hint: choose something you would actually enjoy doing – even if it pushes you out of your comfort zone a bit.





Fancy tyin' up your black tie and brushing off your tails? Plan yourselves an evening of sophistication...

TALK AT YOUR CHURCH



Let your church know what you are about to do. We can let you have some words and pictures to help you.

BBQ



Have an open house with a BBQ for your friends. See if they can bring some food and use the opportunity to talk to them about your trip.

OUIZ NIGHT



Get together at the pub or in your church hall and hold a quiz night. Charge teams or individuals to enter, but do offer them a small prize if they win.

CAR BOOT SALE/EBAY



You know it's time to get rid of those snakeskin trousers and game of Ker-plunk. Trust us – they'll sell and you'll be able to close the cupboard door again.

CAKES AFTER CHURCH



A good long sermon can really take it out of you. A decent cupcake or Victoria sponge at the end of the service is just what the Reverend Doctor ordered.

SPONSORED SLIM



You wanted to lose weight. Do one of these and there is no backing out, which is probably just what you need to motivate you.



Hold a girlie evening of facemasks and manicures. Don't forget to watch 'Grease' while the face pack is working its magic.

OPEN GARDEN



Are you blessed with a decentsized garden and green fingers? Show off your skills with a garden party – if it's good enough for Her Majesty...

WINE TASTING



Have a civilised evening with some friends. See if everyone can bring a different bottle. All together now: "pleasingly citrusy, with just a hint of asparagus..."

CLEANING & ODD JOBS



Bob-a-job week may have gone the way of the Plesiosaur, but people will always need an extra helping hand.

DINNER PARTY



An excuse to do a recipe or two from that Jamie Oliver book (rather than just gawping at the pictures). Charge for entry. Serve fine wine. Talk nonsense. You know the score.

CLOTHES SWAP



Let the moths go free! Clear out the wardrobe and share what you find with your friends. Swapping is free, but charge them to take part.

Offer a well-earned night off to some deserving parents and keep their children entertained for an evening. Maybe you should keep the Kerplunk after all (see 5).

CAR WASH



As the song says: 'You might not ever get rich/but let me tell you it's much better than digging a ditch' A good team (or family) activity.

Many companies have matching schemes. Every pound raised they match. Speak to your employer and see if they will give or match money on an event.





SWIMMING THE CHANNEL

Mission Direct's very own Clare Truter and Jackie Johnston got their feet wet and raised over £1000. As crazy as this sounds, Jackie and Clare decided to swim the equivalent of the Channel in the 12 weeks leading up to Christmas. For you mathematicians out there, that's 22 miles or 1416 lengths of a 25m pool.


FLAMINGO FLOCKING

The Hunt Family turned their village pink to raise money for their trip to Zambia. They filled friends and neighbours' lawns with inflatable pink flamingos, using a fundraising technique known as "flamingo flocking".

They bought ten of the inflatable creatures online, having heard of the flocking craze in the United States. They attached each one to garden cane with fluorescent pink tape and set about 'migrating' them.

Households were then delivered a letter declaring "You've Been Flocked" explaining that the colourful act of sabotage was committed to raise money for their planned work in Zambia. Victims were then told "If your household insurance does not cover you against flamingo flocking ... for a small donation, a team of expert flamingo wranglers will come and remove these feathered friends back to their usual feeding grounds."

The recipients were then allowed to suggest other homes that might be game (or wildfowl) for a laugh.


